Recently our Brisbane team decided to put their volunteer hours to good use, teaming up with OzHarvest as part of their 'Cooking for a Cause' initiative.

Heading over to OzHarvest's local production kitchen, they enthusiastically got to work in the kitchen, cooking up **68** nutritious and delicious meals for local charities, using **34kg** of food that would have otherwise gone to landfill. In their efforts, they prevented **33kg** of CO2 emissions, providing benefits not only to the local community, but also the environment.

# International Women's Day

Across our service centres



Every year on March 8, International Women's Day offers us the chance to pause and recognise the achievements of women across every part of society — and here at Ausco Modular, that includes the women on our worksites, in our offices, and across every team in the business.

From morning teas to toolbox talks and guest speaker sessions, our people came together to show support and celebrate the women helping shape the future of modular construction. While women currently represent just 21% of the total construction workforce in Australia, at Ausco we're proud to be well ahead of the curve. Women now make up 32% of our total team, and 2025 is already shaping up to be a record year for female participation, particularly in our manufacturing operations — traditionally one of the most male-dominated areas of the industry.

One standout example is the MMC Housing project, where we've welcomed 44 new apprentices, 15 of whom are women. That's 34% female representation on a major national project — a milestone we're incredibly proud of. These numbers reflect something bigger: a cultural shift happening both inside and outside our organisation. Women are challenging stereotypes, stepping into leadership, and paving the way for a more balanced industry.

As we look to the future, we'll continue investing in a workforce where women are supported, celebrated, and given every opportunity to succeed.

To all the women at Ausco — thank you. Your contributions help us build not just modular spaces, but stronger teams, better communities, and a more inclusive industry.

### WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE ESG SPACE IN 2025

Sustainability will be a major focus across our operations in 2025, with several key initiatives already underway and more to be announced throughout the year.

Our Brisbane and Melbourne teams are progressing through testing of a new portable hybrid generator solution that combines solar, battery and a generator to dramatically reduce diesel use at our customers' sites while also decreasing overall emissions. Testing in both Queensland and Victoria has allowed us to evaluate performance in different conditions, ensuring that the product performs to standards that our customers expect.

In the coming weeks we will be releasing our 2024 Sustainability Report, which addresses some of the upcoming changes and requirements involved with new sustainability reporting legislation. This will highlight how our teams are preparing for the future and strengthening our ESG reporting frameworks.

Our team have been delivering monthly ESG training across the business, helping to build general knowledge about our obligations and initiatives, helping all staff unpack some of the jargon that is prevalent across the industry. With a different theme each month, the sessions will continue throughout the year to expand on ways that all of our service centres can get involved with sustainability and ethics.

Driving real, practical change, our team are investigating opportunities to decarbonise our machinery, starting with investigating how to efficiently electrify our forklift fleet. This is planned to be supported by future solar installations at our service centres, allowing us to generate and use our own energy with less reliance on the grid. Our volunteering program is also set to continue throughout the year as we investigate ways we can support communities with ongoing work throughout the year. This will contribute to maintaining and improving our EcoVadis certification which remains a strong priority.

There's plenty to come in the ESG space in 2025. We are incredibly excited to continue working toward a cleaner future, supporting our communities and customers around Australia.
